

Maximum Barn Grant Amounts Increase From \$2,500 to \$5,000 Per Barn in 2024

Barn Grant Applications are Now Being Accepted

Since being recognized in 2020 by Preservation PA with the Henry A. Jordan Award for outstanding historic preservation efforts at the local level, the HGAC Barn Preservation Project and Grant Program has received a number of generous contributions specifically intended to help maintain, rehabilitate, and preserve the historic barns within Adams County. This year, because of these contributions and other fund raising successes, we are able to increase the maximum amount of individual barn preservation grants from \$2,500 to \$5,000. Funds are still limited, so grantees may not receive the full amount that they request, but our objective is to provide some help to every historic preservation project that we feel is a good one.

Applications for HGAC Barn Preservation Grants are now being accepted for consideration until March 1, 2024. Grants are only awarded to historic barns that are within Adams County and that are listed on the HGAC Barn Register, which currently includes 412 barns. Once again this year, additional funds are available to HGAC to be awarded to historic barns in the Adams County Fruit Belt area.

Since 2013, the HGAC Barn Preservation Project and Grant Program has provided grants totaling over \$76,000 to over 45 owners of historic barns within Adams County. The individual grant amount from HGAC must be matched by the barn owner's labor or a cash layout of an equal amount for materials or contract labor.

Application guidelines and the application itself are available on-line at **HGAConline.org**. From the homepage, enter the words "Barn Grants" into the "Search" tab, then click on "BARN GRANTS" to reveal links to the grant guidelines and application forms. There is no fee to apply for the grant if the barn owner is an HGAC member. If an applicant is not an HGAC member for the year 2024, their application must include a check for \$25 to become a member of HGAC for the year.

What a Difference a Coat of Paint Makes!


