After a successful debut in 2021, the HGAC "Historic Barns Tour of Gettysburg and Adams County" will return on Saturday, September 16 from 10:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. featuring different barns and new activities.

Travel back in time and enjoy this rare opportunity to visit inside SIX historic barns in Gettysburg and Adams County.

The Tour starts at the Historic Round Barn near Cashtown where guests will receive a map showing the location of the barns featured on the Tour along with a booklet describing the barns and the various activities that will be offered at each barn.

Check-in time to start the Tour is from 10:00 a.m. until noon at the Historic Round Barn. This event will be held **rain or shine**.

### TEN ADAMS COUNTY BARNS RECEIVE HGAC BARN GRANTS IN 2023

Since 2013, over 40 barn owners whose barns are on the HGAC Barn Register have received more than \$62,000 in matching grants from HGAC to help pay for the preservation of these historic structures. One of this year's grant recipients, located on Brysonia School Road, the Clyde Orner Barn is #253 on the HGAC Barn Register. Constructed in the late 1700's or early 1800's, its appearance is more in keeping with the precursors of the Pennsylvania Barn that still grace the landscape in Germany, Austria and Switzerland.

"We hope that parents and grand parents will bring their kids to see inside these great old barns. Photographers, bring your cameras!" says event chair, Bob Mcilhenny.

After exploring the Round Barn and Farm Market, participants can then drive to any barn on the Tour in any order and stay as long as they wish. The Tour ends at 4:00 p.m.

The Tour includes privately owned barns that are not usually open to the public. One of the barns on the Tour served as a field hospital during the Battle of Gettysburg.

Each barn on this unique Tour will feature activities throughout the day that are fun and educational. There will be a cider press and cider tastings, and a demonstration of timber framing techniques and the use of a shaving horse and draw knife. Artist, Bobbi Becker, wood carver, Frank Rauscher and members of the Foothills Artists will be displaying and selling their art works. The Panera Tatters will demonstrate tatting and lace making, and Civil War living history characters will tell of life in the mid-

1800's when the barns on the Tour were built. There will also be live performance of music and dance from the 19th century. Information about state-wide barn preservation efforts will be presented by members of the Historic Barn and Farm Foundation of Pennsylvania (HBFF). Ceramic artist, Tom Starr will describe traditional brick-making techniques and will talk about what it's like to live in an old brick barn. There will also be a windshield scavenger hunt called "Barn Quest" for students to identify architectural details of Pennsylvania barns.

All proceeds from this event benefit the award-winning HGAC Barn Preservation Project and Grant Program. In 2020, the "Henry A. Jordan Award" was presented to HGAC by *Preservation PA* for "outstanding historic preservation efforts at the local level."

This Tour is a family-friendly event. All kids under 18 are FREE and must be accompanied by an adult. Admission for adults is \$35 per person in advance, and \$40 on the day of the Tour.

#### **BARN OF THE YEAR AWARD**



HGAC first surveyed this barn in November, 2014 as #169 on the Adams County Barn Register.



The Barn of the Year Award for 2023 went to Sherry Rogers and Clifford Frost for the extensive work done on their barn on Mount Hope Road near Fairfield.

The Rogers-Frost Barn is a circa 1860 extended Pennsylvania Barn constructed by William Culp, brother of Henry Culp of Culp's Hill fame. The barn was plundered twice in the summer of 1863 by Confederate troops on their way to Gettysburg.

When Rogers and Frost purchased the property in 2014, the barn needed extensive repairs to failing timbers and masonry. The barn siding and louvers were damaged and deteriorating.

With the help of contractor, Hugh (Sam) McKinney, over eight years, they methodically addressed significant threats to the barn's existence and completely restored the barn.

Historic Preservation Project Reaches Milestone HGAC Surveys 400th Barn!

After almost 20 years of visiting and surveying barns, a team of volunteers from the HGAC Barn Preservation Project recently added the 400th barn to the HGAC Register of historic Adams County Barns.

Barn owners Wayne and Leila Flickinger and their daughters, Alayna and Sarah, welcomed the barn surveyors to their beautiful three-gable Pennsylvania barn buit in1901 along the Cashtown Road just north of the Lincoln Highway. The Flickingers have owned the barn since 2021, and they have wasted no time in securing the longevity of the barn by replacing gutters, repointing the masonry foundation and making other repairs.

Three-gable barns are somewhat rare in Adams County so the survey team relished the opportunity to photograph, measure and record the architectural details of such a barn that has been so well maintained.
